It was particularly impressive that these were essays, poems, and songs written and composed by junior high and high school students. Hearing from tomorrow's leaders and recognizing their commitment to equity instills hope for a brighter future.

The ceremony included the two winning songs written by students with music facilitated and performed by the students with the ROOTS Teaching Artists. "Stop the Violence," written by Mary Matisak's 3rd Period Class at Milkovich Middle School and composed by Esther Fitz kicked off the evening. "Everyone is Equal," written by Violet Taylor's 7th Period Class at Collinwood High School and composed by Charlie Mosbrook concluded the event.

Attendees also heard from Cleveland Cavaliers Executive Vice President and Chief Impact and Equity Officer Kevin Clayton and Cedric Thorbes, a school superintendent who was a finalist in the 2011 Stop the Hate essay program.

So, You Asked: Just What Is ROOTS?

Roots of American Music does not and has never taught individual music lessons.

ROOTS Music Education Programs reinforce social emotional learning standards in K-12 schools.

ROOTS Music Education program, "Blues is the Backbone" is an age-appropriate, cross curricular education program offered for kindergarten and 2nd grade students reinforcing language arts, music, and social emotional learning standards. Through the exploration of blues musicians, history, and culture, the students will improve literacy skills, enhance music skills, and gain confidence through social emotional learning. Blues is the Backbone culminates with students writing lyrics to their own class song.

The Youth Sing Out Songwriting Contest, in collaboration with the Maltz Museum's Stop the Hate program is a classroom-based group competition for 6th-12th grade students. To enter, classrooms must participate in a free workshop with ROOTS of American Music. Working with a teaching artist, across five weekly in-class lessons during the classroom teacher's specified time, the class will pen an original song. This song becomes the class submission to the contest and is judged by a panel of music, theatre, and writing experts selected in partnership with the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. The winning classrooms receive anti-bias education grants for their schools.

ROOTS provides Teaching Artists in Montessori Schools for General Music Classes for 1st-3rd grade; Folk Song/Dance class for 4th-5th grade; and group guitar and ukulele classes for 4th 5th grade students. Engaging class lessons expand knowledge of basic notation, listening, matching pitch, singing, movement, use of pitched and unpitched percussion instruments, folk-dance and rhythm games to enhance social-emotional learning while guided by state music standards.
